
The ACT Scale Modellers Society trialled a "live streaming" of the event which I think should most definitely engender a lot of interest and hopefully result in some new Membership requests.






Pre livestream publicity

We were not able get much publicity for the Youtube livestream before the event and it only came out on the ACTSMS Facebook and emails.

We only had 2 live viewers during the livestream, but one viewer dropped out because he then decided to come and see the show in person. After that we got an additional 145 people who watched the recorded livestream over 4 days.

We also had 5 recorded interviews with modellers showing their work and models. Over the last 4 days one of these interviews had over 350 views and another 2 interviews has well over 200 plus views. I believe that it was the infectious enthusiasm of the people interviewed and the brilliance of their models that somehow drew viewers to these videos.

Summary

Overall, I believe we got some very positive results for our first attempt at creating and sharing a digital experience for a modelling event. Whilst we did not get the pre-event publicity in place, the wonders of social media still manage to bring an estimate of over 300 viewers to the livestream and recorded videos. I believe this in turn generate positive publicity for the Canberra Model Shipwrights Society.

The event also proved that the combination of technology would work together to achieve our goal. We had wired and wireless cameras and microphones and a mobile video studio setup, all connecting to a BYO WiFi network and Internet link. We had some audio problems, and the camera tripod setup was not particularly suitable for the task but for most counts the setup performed above expectations.
